Gender-Based Violence (GBV) remains a major challenge for women in vulnerable settings—especially in urban slums and refugee settlements, where poverty and displacement heighten risks.

For 14 years, AWYAD has championed the rights of women and girls, working to eliminate all forms of violence and inequality.

In 2024, we launched two impactful projects [STEPS & Spotlight Initiative] focused on ending violence against women and girls. Special attention is given to refugee women and women with disabilities—ensuring those most at risk receive the tools, support, and protection needed to reclaim their power.

Breaking Barriers: Empowering Women to Rise Above GBV and Inequality

Through strong collaboration with government ministries and partners, AWYAD continues to support women in Kampala, urban poor communities, and settlements with protection services and start-up grants—enabling them to achieve economic independence and live free from violence.

Hope in Action at Nyakabande Transit Centre!

Since February, AWYAD has been at the forefront of providing urgent protection support to individuals arriving at Nyakabande Transit Centre—a lifeline for many amidst an increasing influx of persons of concern

Thanks to the unwavering support from CARE International Uganda, we've reached 244 people with critical Gender-Based Violence (GBV) and Child Protection services. Among them were 117 children and 127 adults, each with a unique story and a need for compassion, care, and safety.

Under the STEPS Project (Sustainable Transition to Locally Led Emergency and Protection Services), our team continues to show up where it matters most—putting protection first, restoring dignity, and walking alongside the most vulnerable, especially women and children, during times of uncertainty.

Together, we are making every step count toward a safer, more humane future.

& Women's Centre Launch SRH Education at YY Okot Memorial

AWYAD, in partnership with Heroes
Teenagers and Women's Centre, has
launched a Sexual and Reproductive Health
(SRH) Education program at YY Okot
Memorial to address critical challenges
affecting students' retention in school.

A needs assessment conducted prior to the launch revealed that a significant number of children were dropping out of school due to a lack of essential needs, including menstrual hygiene products.





In response, AWYAD and Heroes will be training students on how to make reusable pads, ensuring that girls can manage their menstrual health with dignity and continue their education without disruption.

Additionally, capacity-building sessions for teachers on mental health will be conducted to equip them with the skills needed to identify and support students facing mental health challenges.

This initiative reflects AWYAD's ongoing commitment to promoting inclusive education and well-being for all learners by addressing both reproductive health and mental health needs in schools.

On March 7, 2025, AWYAD marked International Women's Day with a grand celebration in Naguru Go-Down Community, honoring the resilience and achievements of grassroots women.

Since 2024, AWYAD has been empowering vulnerable women in this area, focusing on refugees, HIV-positive individuals, the elderly, and women with disabilities.



As part of this initiative, AWYAD partnered with Opportunity Bank to provide financial literacy training to 150 women.

During the celebrations, 50 women were awarded certificates for successfully completing the training, recognizing their commitment to financial independence.

Additionally, 10 outstanding women received startup grants to boost their businesses—many of whom have already shown remarkable growth.




The event, organized in partnership with KCCA and other key stakeholders, was a powerful testament to the impact of economic empowerment in transforming lives.
